Proposed Service

Name of Proposed Service:

IDN Support for .RENT

Technical description of Proposed Service:

Registry Operator will offer registration of IDNs at the second level under the .rent gTLD. Registry Operator will offer Registrars support for handling IDN registrations in EPP. Registry Operator will handle variant IDNs as follows: By default variant IDNs (as defined in the Registry Operator's IDN tables and IDN Registration Rules) will be blocked from registration. Variant IDNs may be activated when requested by the sponsoring Registrar of the canonical name as described in the IDN Tables and IDN Registration Rules. Active variant IDNs will be provisioned in the TLD's DNS zone file as zone cuts using the same NS resource records as the canonical name.

Consultation

Please describe with specificity your consultations with the community, experts and or others. What were the quantity, nature and content of the consultations?:

We have informally consulted with a number of relevant parties on the introduction of this service. We have consulted with a number of potential registrants who believe that their interests will be well served if they are able to register Internationalized Domain Names. They will be able to register names that match their native language and alphabet. We have consulted with a number of registrars who have showed a great deal of interest in offering Internationalized Domain Names under .rent. We have consulted with various internet users generally, all of whom are very pleased with the idea of .rent offering IDN support. It will make both .rent and the Internet generally more accommodating for a larger group of users. We have also consulted with our backend registry provider, CentralNic, about IDN support and they are very happy to implement IDN support. Further, they have experience with such an implementation and are well prepared for a .rent implementation of IDN support. We have never received any negative feedback whatsoever on .rent offering IDN support.

\nBecause the offering of Internationalized Domain Names support by new gTLDs is so common to new gTLDs and ICANN alone normally approves the service, we feel that further consultations with other groups is not necessary. However, if ICANN would like further consultation, we are happy to do so.

\nConsultations with end users were appropriate, and the end users that we have consulted with are very excited about IDN support with .rent. These consultations were informal in nature.

We believe that all parties would endorse the introduction of this service as it does not have any negative effect on any parties and only offers more choice and flexibility to internet users and registrants.\n

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The following provision would be added to Exhibit A of the .rent RA:
4. Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs) Registry Operator may offer registration of IDNs at the second and lower levels provided that Registry Operator complies with the following requirements: 4.1. Registry Operator must offer Registrars support for handling IDN registrations in EPP. 4.2. Registry Operator must handle variant IDNs as follows: 4.2.1. By default variant IDNs (as defined in the Registry Operator's IDN tables and IDN Registration Rules) must be blocked from registration. 4.2.2. Variant IDNs may be activated when requested by the sponsoring Registrar of the canonical name as described in the IDN Tables and IDN Registration Rules. 4.2.3. Active variant IDNs must be provisioned in the TLD's DNS zone file as zone cuts using the same NS resource records as the canonical name. 4.3. Registry Operator may offer registration of IDNs in the following languages/scripts (IDN Tables and IDN Registration Rules will be published by the Registry Operator as specified in the ICANN IDN Implementation Guidelines): 4.3.1. Arabic language 4.3.2. Greek script 4.3.3. Hebrew language 4.3.4. Latin script 4.3.5. Lao language 4.3.6. Russian language 4.3.7. Thai language 4.3.8. Japanese language 4.3.9. Korean language 4.3.10. Chinese language
