ICANN Final Determination

Re: Notice of Registry Operator Request for Termination of Registry Agreement - .iinet

On 5 July 2016, Connect West Pty. notified ICANN of its intent to terminate the .iinet Registry Agreement entered into on 3 July 2014. Pursuant to Section 4.4(b) of the Registry Agreement, Registry Operator may terminate the Registry Agreement for any reason upon one hundred eighty (180) calendar day advance notice.

Pursuant to the terms of Section 4.5 of the Registry Agreement, ICANN consulted with Connect West Pty. assess whether to transition operation of the .iinet top-level domain (TLD) to a successor Registry Operator.

On November 4, 2016, ICANN made a preliminary determination that operation of the .iinet TLD need not be transitioned to a successor Registry Operator based on the following rationale:

- Only one domain name is registered in the .iinet TLD and it is mandated by the Registry Agreement (nic.iinet).
- Connect West Pty., in its function as the Registry Operator has represented to ICANN that it does not sell, distribute or transfer control or use of any registrations in the .iinet TLD to third parties.
- Transitioning operation of the TLD is not necessary to protect the public interest.

On 17 December 2016, after a 30-day period for comments by interested parties, no comments were received. Pursuant to Section 4.4(b) of the Registry Agreement, ICANN will proceed to terminate the .iinet Registry Agreement by 1 January 2017.
