Section I: General Overview and Next Steps

ICANN's Draft FY13 Operating Plan and Budget_describes the planned activities and required resources for the fiscal year. These activities are based on ICANNs strategic objectives, Senior Staff and Board discussions and community input. The Bylaws require that the draft FY13 Operating Plan be posted by the 17th of May to ensure adequate opportunity for community feedback. This year it was decided to post on 1 May in order to ensure more time for community comment and response. The Framework for the Operating Plan and Budget was posted earlier this year as well, moving from mid-February to mid-January to allow more time to work with the community on this year's priorities and plan. The community had sessions with the Finance team in January via webinars, March at the Costa Rica ICANN meeting, May via webinars and again in Prague with face to face work sessions.

The final FY13 budget was submitted to the ICANN Board for adoption at its 44th meeting in Prague on 23 June 2012 and posted on 26 June 2012.

After further community feedback and discussion regarding the public comment responses, ICANN staff returned to the public comments and responses to those comments to provide more clarity and facts as needed to any of the originally submitted comments.

The comments received from the community were again extremely valuable to the ICANN Finance team, in understanding the community's priorities for the FY13 fiscal year and their need for further early input into the Financial and Operating plan documents in the next year. Two things occurred out of this process: (1) ICANN staff went back and re-evaluated certain responses that the community felt needed more detailed responses and (2) ICANN staff engaged the community in 3 Ad Hoc Community groups to discuss key components of the Budget Process in order to begin to see improvements in FY14. The groups have met 2 times; we will meet once more before Toronto and again in Toronto to continue discussions on: Strategic Planning for Finance related work; Incorporating Community needs into the timeline related to creating budget documents; and the structure and content of each finance/budget document.

The ICANN Finance team appreciates the community's input and interest in improving the process and the outcomes of the budget and will continue to work together in FY14.
