Name of Proposed Service:

RSEP Application Release of Two Letters for .bmw and .mini

Technical description of Proposed Service:

Pursuant to Section 2 of Specification 5 of the Registry Agreement between ICANN and Bayerische Motoren Werke Aktiengesellschaft ("Registry Operator"), we request the release of two-character ASCII labels that do not appear on the ISO 3166-1 alpha-2 list, or otherwise in the event there is no corresponding government or country code operator, or in the event the Registry Operator makes such proposition and receives ICANN's approval.\text{\text{V}}\text{\text{I}}

Consultation

Please describe with specificity your consultations with the community, experts and or others. What were the quantity, nature and content of the consultations?:

Registry Operator has not undertaken direct consultation with the community, experts or others. Registry Operator relies on the historical development of the process by which registry operators requested limited release of reserved two-character names, beginning with the .name TLD in 2006 and extending to a significant number of registry operators of TLDs delegated during the New gTLD Program. Registry Operator notes that ICANN, in accordance with the Registry Services Evaluation Policy, has made a preliminary review of whether similar release proposals might raise significant competition, security or stability issues, and did not identify any such issues. The Registry Operator furthermore notes that the Governmental Advisory Committee in its March 27, 2014 Singapore Communique indicated that it had no major concerns about brand owners seeking approval for the release of country names and two-letter and character codes at the second level.Registry Operator is a brand owner seeking approval for the release of two-character codes in the .BMW and .MINI TLDs, for which it has applied to operate as a ".Brand" TLD in accordance with Specification 13 to the Registry Agreement. Since such names will be used for the purposes of the representation of our company, it is almost impossible to anticipate any abuse or misconduct, or that such domain name could be confusing to users or otherwise offensive to any country.\r\n

As Registry Operator intends to operate the .BMW and .MINI TLDs as a .Brand TLD wherein only it, its Affiliates or Trademark Licensees are permitted as registrants of domain names, Registry Operator relies on its business plans and marketing strategies in concluding that real demand and utility exists for the release of two-character labels to support its activities in the TLDs. e. Who would endorse the introduction of this service? What were the nature and content of these consultations?:

Registry Operator, as the eventual registrant of the relevant domain names in its .Brand TLDs, supports the release of two-character labels for use in conjunction with its business purposes in a non-confusing manner. Furthermore, Registry Operator's customers and partners who will utilize and identify the .BMW and .MINI TLDs as the trusted namespace associated with Registry Operator would benefit from and support this proposal. As indicated above, ICANN and the GAC have not identified concerns or significant issues in the release of such labels. \text{Vn}

In light of the intended use of the TLD, the lack of objection from ICANN and the GAC, and, in relevant cases, the consent of ICANN for the release of particular labels on request, there does not appear to be any interested governmental authority, entity, or individual who would object to the release of two-character labels in accordance with this proposal. In the event that a relevant concern be raised, Registry Operator is prepared to engage the concerned party in accordance with any process specially developed for such purpose or as otherwise required by ICANN.\r\n\r\n

Registry Operator would seek to begin registering two-character labels as soon as practicable in accordance with Specifications 5 and 13 to its Registry Agreement, including, if applicable, any further application to or approval from ICANN, GAC member, country, or registry authority as may be required. In accordance with the requirements of Specification 13 to the Registry Agreement, only Registry Operator, its Affiliates or Trademark Licensees may register domain names in the .BMW and .MINI TLDs incorporating released two-character labels at the second level \r\n

Not applicable; released two-character labels will be subject to the same protections and safeguards available to all other permissible strings available for registration in the .BMW and .MINI TLDs.\r\n

Contractual Provisions

List the relevant contractual provisions impacted by the Proposed Service:

Registry Agreement, Specification 5, Section 2, Two-character labels. All two-character ASCII labels shall be withheld from registration or allocated to Registry Operator at the second level within the TLD. Such labels may not be activated in the DNS, and may not be released for registration to any person or entity other than Registry Operator, provided that such two-character label strings may be released to the extent that Registry Operator reaches agreement with the related



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government and country-code manager of the string as specified in the ISO 3166-1 alpha-2 standard. The Registry Operator may also propose the release of these reservations based on its implementation of measures to avoid confusion with the corresponding country codes, subject to approval by ICANN. Upon conclusion of Registry Operator's designation as operator of the registry for the TLD, all such labels that remain withheld from registration or allocated to Registry Operator shall be transferred as specified by ICANN. Registry Operator may self-allocate and renew such names without use of an ICANN accredited registrar, which will not be considered Transactions for purposes of Section 6.1 of the Agreement.
