Dear Paul:

The companies and associations sponsoring mTLD Top Level Domain, LLC (dotMobi) have many concerns about the proposed agreement for dottel. I have been requested to officially notify ICANN on behalf of the sponsoring community behind dotMobi. This letter summarizes the concerns of the community and suggests next actions that ICANN may want to consider for fixing the situation.

Background

dotMobi has a well established sponsoring community of mobile and telecommunications companies including investors such as Nokia, Vodafone, Microsoft, T-Mobile, Google, Telefonica, Telecom Italia, GSM Association, Orascom, Syniverse, 3 Hutchinson, Samsung, and Ericsson. We have public support from CTIA, Mobile Marketing Association, Mobile Entertainment Forum, Rural Cellular Association, and the Canadian Wireless and Telecommunications Association.

dotMobi was awarded the .mobi sponsored top level domain in July 2005 after five years of work through a transparent and open process with ICANN. The dotMobi service is scheduled for launch in May for the sunrise trademark period and September for open registrations.



Concerns

We have the following concerns regarding the proposed agreement for dottel:

1. Sponsoring Community

No sponsoring community for dottel has been publicly disclosed in their application or proposed agreement. The original dotMobi application was turned down when Nokia submitted the first application years ago. dotMobi expanded the sponsoring community to include a broad and diverse representation of companies and associations with a global footprint. Why has dottel not been held to the same standard of community sponsorship that dotMobi had to produce? dotMobi wants to understand why this important part of the process has not been more transparent. dotMobi wants to understand why we had to prove a higher level of sponsorship when dottel appears to have no sponsors.

2. Price and Fair Competition

Dottel competes directly with many of the services that dotMobi provides or plans to provide in the future. dotMobi's application has been public record since the publication of our original application. dotMobi has two direct concerns about the dottel proposed agreement.

a. Price

The dottel agreement proposes \$0.15 per domain while the dotMobi agreement charges \$0.75 per domain. dotMobi has a natural disadvantage to the proposed dottel price while we offer similar services. dotMobi requests for ICANN to provide a fee structure on an equal basis to what has been proposed to dottel.

b. Fair Competition

The dottel agreement is the first time that ICANN proposed to launch two competing sponsored top level domains within a similar time period. The dotMobi sponsored top level domain has a global supporting constituency while dottel has no public supporting constituency. Both sponsored top level domains offer similar services, but dottel has been provided with a price advantage. Dottel also had to follow a less transparent process and pass a much lower level of justification than dotMobi. dotMobi requests that ICANN require dottel to follow the same level of transparency and justification that dotMobi had to follow.

Next Steps

dotMobi looks forward to hearing back from ICANN on these key points. We request that the dottel proposed contract undergo a further review. Dottel must live up to the same standards that ICANN required of dotMobi and other sponsored top level domains for sponsorship. We formally request that ICANN change the pricing in the dotMobi agreement to \$0.15. We formally request that the dottel agreement not be approved at the present time.

We look forward to working with ICANN on this endeavor.
