What is the job?

- Proposed originally in 2002 by ICANN president Stuart Lynn
- In bylaws: “There shall be a staff position... that shall be responsible for co-ordinating the various aspects of public participation in ICANN, including the Website and various other means of communicating with and receiving input from the general community of Internet users.”
- My summary: get more input; better input; and make it count

Why is it needed?

- Poor filtering of information
- Excellent ideas lost (“I told ICANN two years ago”)
- Frustrations
- Not enough interaction or people
- Insiders / history
