Dear Registry Operator,

We are pleased to share that ICANN has launched the <u>Community gTLD Change Requests</u> service. This service provides a method for community gTLD registry operators to seek modifications to Specification 12 without removing the Community Registration Policies, excessively broadening or narrowing registrant eligibility and/or name selection requirements or resulting in significant negative impact to the TLD Community. It is based on the procedure developed by the Community gTLD Change Request Process Working Group and the ICANN organization, with <u>input</u> from the Registries Stakeholder Group and the ICANN Community.

To be eligible for the service, a Community gTLD must have a Registry Agreement that includes Specification 12 with the section title of "Community Registration Policies" or "TLD Policies." As defined in the procedure, all change requests will be posted for a 30-day comment period. Statuses of submitted change requests will also be visible on the Community gTLD Change Requests webpage.
