Thank you for your submission requesting that the ICANN organization remove your curriculum vitae posted on our website at: <https://www.icann.org/resources/reviews/aoc/cct/applications>. I've researched your request within the ICANN organization and have worked with the Communications team to provide you with this response.

As an active member of the ICANN family, you may be familiar with the [ICANN Bylaws](#) – in particular Section 3.1. [OPEN AND TRANSPARENT](#), which states that: "ICANN and its constituent bodies shall operate to the maximum extent feasible in an open and transparent manner and consistent with procedures designed to ensure fairness ...". The ICANN organization ordinarily maintains a full record of all submissions for transparency and historical purposes. However, based on the personal nature of this document and your request, we have removed it from our website.

Therefore, to address your request, the ICANN organization has depublished your curriculum vitae from icann.org. If you navigate to the link provided in your original submission, you will be directed to a page stating that the file has been depublished. Please see: <https://www.icann.org/resources/pages/notice-2017-08-04-en>.

As you may be aware, search engine providers such as Bing, Google, Yahoo, etc. collect, parse, and store data to facilitate fast and accurate information retrieval on the Internet – also known as web indexing. Each search engine has its own policy related to storage and availability of indexed data, which may affect the delivery of search results. In other words, although the ICANN organization has removed your curriculum vitae from our website, it is still possible that search engines could deliver references to your curriculum vitae. Should someone click on these results, they will be directed to the page provided above that states, "This file was depublished at the request of the submitter."
