Accreditation Program for Access to Non-public WHOIS?	Yes, in consultation with the Governmental Advisory Committee, data protection authorities and contracted parties with full transparency to the ICANN community. User groups with a legitimate interest and who are bound to abide by codes of conduct requiring adequate measures of protection could access non-public WHOIS data based on pre-defined criteria and limitations under the accreditation program.	Yes, Registrar and Registry required to provide reasonable access to non-public data to 3rd parties with legitimate interests, except where overridden by interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of data subject; also required to provide access where WP29/European Data Protection Board, relevant court, applicable legislation or regulation provides guidance that provision of data to specified classes of users is lawful.
