ccNSO to Participate in New gTLD Subsequent Procedures PDP Working Group Work Track 5

The Country Code Names Supporting Organization (ccNSO) will participate in the newly created Work Track 5 of the GNSO **[New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Policy Development Process Working Group](#)**. Annebeth Lange (.no) will serve as ccNSO-appointed co-leader of this effort.

GNSO Council Updates

- The Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO) Council nominated Norm Ritchie to replace Emily Taylor as

a candidate for the Second Security, Stability, and Resiliency of the Domain Name System Review Team (SSR2-RT).

- The GNSO Council submitted the **GNSO Review of the GAC ICANN59 Johannesburg Communiqué** to the ICANN Board.
- The GNSO Council directed the Cross-Community Working Group on Internet Governance to explore a **new model for community collaboration**.

Review of the Customer Standing Committee Charter

Starting in October 2017, the ccNSO and the Registry Stakeholder Group will review the **charter** of the **Customer Standing Committee (CSC)**. The review team will adopt a lightweight approach and will consult with the full CSC on potential areas for improvement. The goal is to submit a final report to the ccNSO and GNSO Councils in April 2018.

Importance of Data Accuracy

The American Registry for Internet Numbers (ARIN) maintains a registry of unique IP addresses and Autonomous System Numbers and provides accurate registration information about these resources. An accurate registry contributes to the operability and stability of the Internet in a number of ways.

By keeping your registration information up to date, you improve the quality of the data in WHOIS and help prevent the hijacking of your resources. You also assist law enforcement agencies in conducting investigations.

Six Scripts Integrated into the Second Version of Root Zone Label Generation Rules

The second version of Root Zone Label Generation Rules (**RZ-LGR-2**) is now available. It integrates six scripts - Arabic, Ethiopic, Georgian, Khmer, Lao, and Thai. The community-developed RZ-LGR-2 provides a conservative and secure method to determine valid top-level Internationalized Domain Name (IDN) labels and their variant labels, if any. In accordance with the **Call for Generation Panels**, five additional scripts - Hebrew, Myanmar, Sinhala, Tibetan, and Thaana - are being actively solicited.

"Statistical Analysis of DNS Abuse in gTLDs" Report Available for Public Comment Until 19 September 2017

The **Competition, Consumer Trust, and Consumer Choice Review Team** (CCTRT) requested the study to measure rates of common forms of abusive activities in the Domain Name System (DNS) - such as spam, phishing, and malware distribution. The study compares rates of these activities between new and legacy generic top-level domains (gTLDs). It also employs inferential statistical analysis to measure the effects of DNS Security Extensions (DNSSEC), domain parking, and registration restrictions on abuse rates. The analysis uses historical data from the first three full years of the New gTLD Program (2014-2016). **[Learn more and submit your comments here.](#)**



Universal Acceptance Issue: Report the Problem

The Universal Acceptance (UA) Steering Group (UASG) is a community initiative supported by the ICANN organization formed to educate and ensure that systems are UA-aware. UA-readiness means that Internet-enabled applications, devices, and system can successfully recognize all domain names, including IDNs and new gTLDs.
