





GDD: New gTLD Program

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

The New gTLD Program is driving the largest expansion of the Domain Name System ever. Hundreds of new top-level domain names are being introduced into the Internet on a rolling basis.

The New gTLD Program is meant to enhance competition, innovation and choice.

1,229 Total registry agreements signed.

1,215 Total strings delegated.

- Net auction proceeds: \$233 million
 - Proceeds reserved.
 - Cross-community working group to develop proposal(s) for mechanism for allocating new gTLD auction proceeds.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

IDNs at the top-level enable Internet users to access domain names in local languages and scripts.

IDN ccTLDs allow countries and territories to represent their respective names scripts other than US-ASCII characters. \odot Greek script generation panel formed




Case Volume Trending

Cases Created & Resolved




Case Backlog

Quarter End Volume Trending







MISSION STATEMENT

Attract more active and engaged participants from the MEAC region to contribute to ICANN's policy development processes and to acquire leading roles within the ICANN community.

STRATEGIC FOCUS AREAS

- 1. Support **secure**, **stable**, **and resilient DNS** infrastructure in the MEAC region;
- 2. Promote a healthy and competitive **domain name marketplace** in the MEAC region; and
- 3. Clarify **ICANN's role** in an evolving Internet ecosystem through engagement with the MEAC community.

YEAR 1 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- 1. Develop tailored and **customized programs for engaging various stakeholder** groups from academia, civil society, governments, among others;
- 2. Support the **DNS Entrepreneurship Center** in developing local expertise to help grow the domain name market in the region;
- 3. Develop local capacities through the **"train the trainer" program** to support capacity building activities in the region.

Task Force on Arabic Script IDNs

- Formed by the community in Oct 2013 as an outcome of the Middle East Strategy work
- First linguistic group to tackle Label Generation Rules (LGR) at the root level and made its final submission at ICANN55 in Marrakech
- Currently working on:
 - LGR at the second level; and
 - Universal acceptance of Arabic script IDNs
 - Last face-to-face meeting took place at the ICANN Istanbul Hub 24-26 September

Training and Supporting Stakeholders

- Continue academic engagement program with CCK in Tunisia, and seek more similar partnerships
- Continue to support the the DNS Entrepreneurship Center
- Be part of the Middle East NOG roadshows, lead on DNS related training, and DNSSEC deployment
- Support more local trainers to become lead trainers on DNS and DNSSEC
- Train CERTs and LEAs, and strengthen engagement with them



Africa Update



Overarching Objectives of the Africa Strategy

Transform the DNS & Internet Industry in Africa by Facilitating capacity development and Cultivating an environment for the emergence of an Africa grown domain name industry and business.

Promote Awareness and Meaningful Participation of Africa in ICANN & the wider IG Ecosystem in partnership with other I* and Af* Organizations.

Over the last four years and as we begin a new season in the Post Transition ICANN, I am confident that we, working with our community, have laid a strong foundation for ICANN in Africa.



Key Highlights in the last Quarter





Our Africa Engagement Office in Nairobi has hosted two premier events so far

1. In October 2016,

- We held the first Africa Stakeholder
 Briefing Day in Nairobi. The meeting

 aimed at promoting the localization of the
 multistakeholder model at the national
 level
- 2. In Jan 2017,
 - We hosted the first capacity-building workshop for the Africa GAC community.

Encouraging Participation in ICANN Programs

Encourage the African community to participate in ICANN's available programs, including online learning opportunities, CROPP, attending events in Africa, supporting the development of these programs, and encouraging new programs such as DNS Entreprenuership and ccTLD education programs. We hope to officially launch the Africa DNS Market Study at ICANN58

Training and Support to Stakeholders

- We plan to keep supporting our flagship DNSSEC project with focus on signings for the countries already trained.
- Encourage the IDN program in Africa and focus more on Supporting DNS Entrepreneurship.
- We also seek to keep hosting our annual Topical Workshop program in partnership with other institutions.






Avg hdct: Average Headcount over a 6-month period (Jul - Dec 2016)


FY17 Year-to-date (Jul-Dec 2016) New gTLD Program Expenses vs Budget and FY16





FY17 Year-to-date (Jul-Dec 2016) Funding


