

Statement of interest – Anders Rafting

Having applied for the SSR DNS Review Team of ICANN I hereby announce my statement of interest. I am employed at the Swedish Post and Telecom Agency (PTS) at the Network Security Department since September 2000. There my interest has been to take measures to improving the resiliency, robustness and stability of the infrastructure for public electronic networks and especially the Internet. The measures are funded by the government and done in cooperation with different involved parties and stakeholders providing network based services. I have been performing tests and investigations of issues related to the availability and reliability regarding the critical infrastructure such as the Domain Name System, IXP redundancy and inter-domain routing. I have also been involved in compiling a strategy for a safer Internet in Sweden now adopted by the government and was one of the authors of a strategy for robust infrastructure for electronic communications in Sweden 2009-2011. In May 2009 I participated in the management of a network disaster recovery exercise with participation of more than twenty telephony and Internet service providers, providers of electric power, the police and emergency forces at the municipalities. I am a member of the group responsible for planning the next nationwide exercise in which we will concentrate on scenarios with attacks towards critical resources in the Internet. At present I am engaged in different projects to promote the deployment of DNSSEC and IPv6 in Sweden, especially in the public sector.

As a member of the Governmental Advisory Committee to ICANN having participated in a number of GAC/ICANN meetings since 2003, my interest primarily is focused on the stable and robust operation of the DNS as a whole, the DNS root zone and the IANA function including the assignment of IP addresses.

I have no known conflicts of interest with respect to ICANN and my engagement with companies, organizations or individuals. I understand the responsibilities of the SSR DNS Review Team and the commitment that is required and have gained the support of my employer to devote the time needed to fulfill the assigned tasks.
