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Section I: General Overview and Next Steps

The Ethiopic script community has formed the Ethiopic script Generation Panel (GP), which in turn has developed a *Proposal for the Ethiopic Script Root Zone Label Generation Rules* ([Proposal](#) and [Proposal Documentation](#) [PDF, 2.01 MB]). As per the LGR Procedure [PDF, 772 KB], this proposal is being posted for public comments to allow those who have not participated in the Ethiopic script GP to make their views known to the GP. Ethiopic script GP will now submit the final proposal with any changes to reflect the public comments, for evaluation by the Integration Panel (IP). If evaluation by the IP is successful, the Proposal for the Ethiopic Script Root Zone Label Generation Rules will be integrated into the Label Generation Rules for the Root Zone. Otherwise, the proposal will be sent to the GP with comments for further consideration and revision.
