#### Comments that encouraged additions to the report (3):

BC: Not convinced that Study 2 and Study 3 are needed, but concerned that the lack of evidence of collisions might cause collision risks to not receive the necessary attention

BJ: Expected the report to address name collisions involving internationalized domain names (IDNs)

NCSG: Wanted an Executive Summary added, and more information on the rigor of the prior works search and each of the datasets

## **Section IV: Analysis of Comments**

<u>General Disclaimer</u>: This section intends to provide an analysis and evaluation of the comments submitted along with explanations regarding the basis for any recommendations provided within the analysis.

None of the comments from organizations and individuals suggested significant revisions to the content of the initial report. Three of the four comments suggested additions to the report. The following addresses those three comments.

- BC: The concern about collision risks potentially not receiving the necessary attention due to lack of evidence of collisions will be addressed in the conclusion section to be drafted for the final report.
- BJ: Section 2.1 of the report draft mentions IDNs and states in its last sentence, "In this report, usage of 'TLD' refers to both gTLDs and ccTLDs." Whenever prior work addressed both gTLDs and ccTLDs, the report draft uses "TLD" so as to include both, and prior work specific to ccTLDs is explicitly called out in Section 3.6.6 and Section 4.2.1. The report's existing mentions of gTLDs will be double-checked to confirm they should not be broadened to also include ccTLDs, and the conclusion of the report will address both gTLDs and ccTLDs.

NCSG: An Executive Summary and a statement regarding the rigor of the prior works search will be added to the report. Regarding the dataset information, none of the datasets are publicly available or otherwise available to the author, so the relevant publicly available information on the datasets' characteristics has already been included in the report or referenced.

Given the comments, the final report will be drafted, and a final proposed version will be released for public comment.
