"I look forward to reinforcing ICANN's outreach to all stakeholders and strengthening the ongoing inclusive dialogue with Europe's Internet users, national governments, EU institutions and business," said Spiller. "I'm excited about contributing to the organization's crucial role in keeping the global Internet open to all and in providing an extraordinary platform for social and economic progress."

Before joining SAS, Spiller, a lawyer by training, spent 10 years working on global public policy and legal issues involving energy, defense and aerospace.
