# Government background



- Report on functioning of SIDN (2001)
  - Asked by Parliament in 1998
  - self regulation mechanism works, should be continued
  - But basic safeguards needed
- Study on discontinuity .nl (2004)
  - High usage > 1 M registrations, 3<sup>d</sup> ccTLD worldwide
  - High penetration in NL; > 60%,
  - Failure; costs for economy, potential damage to society
  - Resolution fails; ~  $\in$  500 M;
  - Registration frozen; ~ €75 M



- Legislation Initiative (apr 2004)
  - Telecom Act logical vehicle
  - Compatible with self regulation
  - But investigate alternative solutions







- Background SIDN
  - Dutch private sector company
  - Responsibilities and accountability defined by Dutch national law
  - Accountable to LIC
  - Government integral part of Local Internet Community
  - Continuity .nl zone responsibility of SIDN.
- March 2004: SIDN Initiative to enter dialogue
  - Government welcome to contribute to continuity safeguards
  - Mutual recognition of roles SIDN and government

- Continuity .nl
  - Keep '.nl service' up; resolution and access to registration
- Sovereignty
  - maintain relationship .nl with Netherlands and Dutch registrants, and subject to Dutch law
- Registration policy
  - Maintain neutral, open and transparant consultation procedures, involving relevant stakeholders
- ... under all circumstances







- Recognition role SIDN by Government
- IP-rights remain with SIDN

- Devise possible additional arrangements and measures








- Maintain link registry .nl and the Netherlands
- Operational
  - Continuation of Delegation
  - Ensuring Name Server Function (NSF)
  - Ensuring Data Entry Function (DEF)
- Naming policy
  - Ensure interest of all stakeholders are taken into account;
  - Ensure objective criteria, non-discrimination and transparency.

- Safeguarding continuity of .nl crucial for economy and society
- Own responsibilities; room for independent policy by both parties
- Sustain self-organization and self-regulation
- Use existing (legal) frameworks and mutual agreements, to avoid need for additional legislation







- - Formalize relations between SIDN and both Government and ICANN
  - Recognition SIDN by Government and ICANN as registry .nl
  - Maintain relation .nl with Netherlands
    - Redelegation; current mechanism ICANN
    - Condition: Appointment registry by LIC including government.
    - Necessary: Appoint entity(ies) which represent LIC with no formal link with SIDN







- Name Server Function (NSF)
  - .nl zone file available under all circumstances, independent of what might happen with the registry
  - Requires operationally independent nameserver (TTP)
  - Requires co-operation of ICANN

- Complex issue, still questions left;
- acceptable level of risk and period of discontinuity ('freezing')?
- To what extent does the combination of existing & proposed measures already diminish risks to an acceptable level?
- additional measures proportional to the risk of discontinuity?



- Accessibility .nl
  - Competition law applies
- Registration policy subject to Dutch law
  - Maintain relation registry .nl with Netherlands
- Assure broad consultation LIC
  - Institutionalize "domain name debate"







- SIDN is and remains entitled
- Avoid problems at possible restart after redelegation
- No additional measures identified







- Formalisation relationships and recognition SIDN
- Incorporate entity to represent and coordinate LIC in the event of redelegation process
- operationally independent nameserver (TTP) with special status
- Institutionalize consultation process LIC for major naming policy changes

- Limited set of additional arrangements and measures (appr. 10-15)
- Possible within
  - framework of agreed common guiding principles
  - ICANN (re)delegation procedures
- Proposed measures = 'total package'
- By complementary arrangements between parties: government, registry and ICANN

- Letter of Intent to be signed Dec 2004
  - develop proposals for additional measures in joint project and intention of implementing them
- Conditions;
  - Have to comply to mutually agreed guiding principles
  - Assesment of feasability, implementability, legal resilience, etc
  - to be realized during normal functioning SIDN
  - Combined consultation by SIDN and Government
